RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The SRCF General Rules & Regulations apply to this show.
2. All steers entered in the Steer Show and accepted by the livestock committee must be consigned to the sale and must be processed for consumption or sent to resale.
3. Each exhibitor assumes all liability in case of death or injury to his or her steer until sold, at which time the purchaser assumes the liability.
4. Proof of ownership, or copy of lease agreement, must accompany your animal at the initial weigh-in.
5. The Livestock Committee reserves the right to review any entries, and may excuse any steer or exhibitor due to misconduct from entry in the steer show and/or sale, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the overall show and sale.

INITIAL WEIGH-IN

- Steers must be delivered to the designated location during the scheduled day and time for initial weigh-in.
- The steer must weigh a minimum of 650 pounds at the initial weigh-in
- All cattle entered in the show must be castrated and healed by the initial weigh-in.

FINAL WEIGH-IN

- Steers must be delivered, by the exhibitor, to the June Ates Arena during the scheduled day and time for final weigh-in. No steers will be accepted at any other time without approval of the Steer Committee.
- Steers must have no horns longer than one (1) inch and must be completely healed if surgically removed.
- All steers will be weighed during the final weigh-in. They must weigh a minimum of nine hundred (900) pounds at final weigh-in.

SHOW DAY

- Steers shall be halter broken and gentle. No tranquilizers, nose tongs, or other restraining devices are allowed.
- All steers are required to be housed in their assigned areas.
- The SRCF will provide the initial shavings required for bedding in the areas. Exhibitors will be responsible for providing any extra shavings that he or she wants in their area.
- Each steer must be shown by its owner unless otherwise excused by the Livestock Committee.
- No professional showmen/groom is allowed to assist any exhibitor at the show. ONLY family members, FFA advisors, 4H club advisors, or extension agents are allowed to assist the exhibitors with the fitting and grooming of the steer. Grooming chutes and blowers/hair dryers ARE allowed.
- NO electrical equipment will be allowed at the wash rack area.
- All exhibitors are required to enter the Showmanship contest with their own steer (or their Club/Chapter steer) unless excused by the Livestock Committee. Failure to participate, without prior written approval, will result in disqualification of the exhibitor from the Steer Show and Sale.
- Steers will be divided in classes by weight only. The number of classes will be determined after final weigh-in.

AUCTION

- All steers will be sold to the highest bidder. Any disputes will be settled by the auctioneer.
- The exhibitor is required to assist with sorting and loading the steers. Exhibitor must remove all shavings from the stall and put tin the designated area once steer has been loaded.
