**RECORD BOOKS DUE:** April 16, 2018

**FINAL WEIGH-IN:** Friday, April 6, 2018 @ the SRC Fairgrounds from 12:00 pm-4:00 pm

**SHOW:** Saturday, April 7, 2018 at 5:00 pm

**AUCTION:** Immediately following market swine weight classes

**Current Health Certificate and proof of negative brucellosis and pseudorabies tests are required at check in, no exceptions.**

**A clinic will be offered March 10, 2018 at 8:00 am at Santa Rosa County Fairgrounds.**

**A veterinarian will be available to offer bleeding of all swine at no charge. There is a \$26 laboratory fee for the brucellosis and pseudorabies tests. This fee is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Health certificates will be issues complimentary by the veterinarian. If unable to attend the clinic the exhibitor is responsible for obtaining their own brucellosis and pseudorabies tests and health certificate.**

**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. The SRCF General Rules & Regulations apply to this show.

2. All hogs entered in the Market Swine Show and accepted by the Livestock Committee must be consigned to the sale and must be processed for consumption, or sent to resale.
3. Each exhibitor assumes all liability in case of death or injury to his or her hog until sold, at which time the purchaser assumes the liability.
4. All swine show exhibitors must attend the Mandatory Meeting listed above. A parent or guardian must also be present at this meeting. All market swine exhibitors need to complete their entry using the Eventbrite program prior to or while attending the weigh in on January 6, 2018.
5. Entries are limited to one (1) per student, Club or Chapter. A second animal can be weighed in, but only one can be shown.
6. All exhibitors are required to take part in Swine Showmanship with their own hog (or their club or chapter hog), unless excused by the Swine Committee. Without prior, written, approval, failure to participate will result in disqualification of the exhibitor and hog from the show and sale.
7. The Swine Committee reserves the right to review any entries; and may, by a majority vote, excuse any hog from entry in the Swine Show and/or Sale, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the Show and Sale.
8. Any decision made by the Livestock Committee or its designee concerning these rules shall be conclusive.
9. The Livestock Committee reserves the right to review any entries, and may excuse any swine or exhibitor due to misconduct from entry in the swine show, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the overall show.

### **TAGGING and WEIGHING**

All hogs will be weighed and tagged at date and location listed above.

After tagging day, all hogs are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

It is recommended that all hogs weigh between 70 and 90 pounds at weigh-in.

Changes of exhibitors, clubs, chapters, and/or animals will not be allowed once they are tagged, unless approved by the SRCF Livestock Committee.

All hogs entered in the show must be castrated and healed by the initial tagging.

ONLY Barrows and Gilts will be tagged.

### **SHOW DAY**

All hogs must be delivered to the fair grounds on the final weigh-in date listed above.

**No animal will be permitted to be re-weighed.**

### **SWINE SHOW AND SALE**

Unloading animals is the responsibility of the exhibitor.

**YOU MUST REMAIN WITH YOUR ANIMAL THROUGHOUT THE WEIGH-IN PROCESS.**

All animals must be clean and free of mud. The swine committee requires ear tags to be clean and easily readable.

- **All animals must weigh a minimum of 200 pounds at final weigh-in.** If animal weighs less than 200 pounds, that animal will be disqualified and not permitted to show in the open show.
- There is **NO MAXIMUM** weight; however, exhibitor will only be paid up to 300 pounds.
- In the event that there are a large number of hogs in the show, there may be 2 hogs in a stall.
- It is mandatory that all hogs be fed by 10:00 am on the morning of the show.
- If your hog dies while on the fairgrounds, the Show Committee must be contacted immediately.
- All hogs are expected to be clean and ready for the show. They may be washed in designated areas only – not in stalls.
- Clipping is allowed; ½” guard on body. If your hog is less than ½”
- No baby powder, oils, or show sheen may be used.
- Exhibitors must provide food containers as well as food for their animals. Stalls are equipped with automatic waterers.
- Classes will be divided by weight after all animals have been weighed in.

### **AUCTION**

If you are not prepared to go into the arena with your animal at your assigned time, you will be placed at the end of the line and your hog will be sold last.
